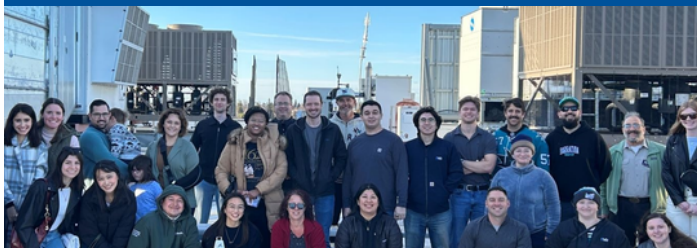

Don't be a phish out of water—spot the scam before it hooks you!



Cyber criminals are increasingly using phishing emails to trick members into revealing sensitive information. These emails often appear to come from trusted sources, such as from ASHRAE officials or members.

Stay vigilant and report suspicious emails!

Ways to Recognize a Phishing Scam

- Urgent or threatening language
- Suspicious sender address
- Unexpected attachments or links
- Generic greetings
- Mismatched URLs
- Spelling and grammar mistakes
- Requests for sensitive information
- Too good to be true offers
- Unusual sender behavior
- Unexpected or unusual requests
